

COLUMBAN FATHERS APPEAL: This weekend, 31st July/1st August, we welcome Fr John Boles to all our weekend masses as he makes an appeal on behalf of the Columban Fathers. Father John is recently returned from Peru after 27 years' service there. We pray for the success of his appeal here in our community.

THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD: The Feast of the Transfiguration recalls and celebrates the revelation by Jesus of his divine glory to three of his friends - Peter, James and John - on a high point on Mount Tabor. Mountains inspiring awe and wonder are linked in many cultures and religions with revelation - here it is showing who Jesus really is: "The Father's Son". While praying on the mountain, Jesus' appearance was changed by a brilliant white light that radiated from him and his clothing. Moses and Elijah, the greatest prophets of the Old Testament, appeared with Jesus, and a voice came from heaven saying, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him" - listening is a faculty we so often do not use in prayer. The purpose of the Transfiguration was to encourage and strengthen the Apostles who were depressed by their Master's prediction of His own Passion and Death. The Apostles were made to understand that His redeeming work had two phases: The Cross, and glory - that we shall be glorified with Him only if we first suffer with Him. This feast is celebrated by the Church this week, on Friday 6th August.
