



REST IN PEACE: Please pray for the repose of the soul of **Joe Sheehan**, who died in Ireland this week, just 9 days short of his 97th birthday. ST CATHERINE OF SIENA: This coming Wednesday, 29 April, is the feast of St Catherine of Siena who, among other things, is a Patron Saint of Nurses. She was born on 25 March 1347 during the outbreak of the plague in Siena. After experiencing a vision of Christ when she was 21, she devoted her life to the sick. You may wish to pray to her this week to intercede for all our nurses and the invaluable work they are doing through the current pandemic.



ST JOSEPH THE WORKER: This feast is celebrated on Friday, 1 May, for the work of human hands.
