## GOSPEL REFLECTION



However can we be "perfect as our Heavenly Father is perfect"? It seems an impossible demand! Even if, with his grace, we fulfil the demands Christ makes: if we "offer the wicked man no resistance....give to anyone who asks...love (our) enemies," even then, how can we claim to be perfect as God is perfect? There is a useful parallel with our created universe. Anything made reflects something of its maker. Each beautiful thing, impressive mountain, towering tree, even the beauties of man-made creations, each thing in its individual perfection, reflects in a small way the beauty and perfection of its Maker and the universe as a whole gives us a

still stronger glimpse of that Reality. Similarly, each and every "image of God," namely each and every human being, insofar as he or she clings to God and lives according to God's grace, is in their individual, personal perfection, "perfect" (in their own way) "as (our) Heavenly Father is perfect" (in His). Above all, the oneness of the 'images' of God in the Church, in the Body of Christ, reflects most gloriously the One-ness and perfection of God. "I have given them the glory," Jesus prays, "that they may be one as we are One."

### Monsignor Bruce Harbert - Thoughts on today's Mass

In today's prayers, the Mass is twice referred to by the word 'mysteries In current speech, 'mysteries' often refers to a criminal investigation, like 'The Ruth Rendell Mysteries'. In the Bible and the Liturgy it has a deeper meaning. When Saint Paul speaks of God's 'mystery' he means the whole of God's plan, from the beginning of creation. This was hidden from mankind, except when God partially revealed it. Then, when Christ came, it was revealed more fully - God plans to save all mankind and share his life with us. That process is ongoing through the presence of Christ in his Church and the work of God's Spirit, particularly through the celebration of Mass. By calling the Mass 'the mysteries' we remember that it draws us into the mystery of God's continuing activity.
