GOSPEL REFLECTION



I shall lift up mine eyes unto the mountains. From whence cometh my help? The Transfiguration took place on top of a high mountain, which tradition identifies as Mount Tabor. When we're on top of a mountain we are lifted out of the routine of our everyday lives and are given a new perspective on the world below. Being in such a high place can be a self-transcending experience, a sort of transfiguration.

Christ has given us a mountain – the Mass. The Mass is our "high mountain" where we can be set apart from the busyness of our daily lives. The *transfiguration*

that we experience in the Mass is that transforming encounter with the Risen Lord, in which he comes among us to raise us up to Himself. United with Christ in the Mass we can say, "Lord, it is good for us to be here." With the strength that comes from Holy Communion we allow the Lord to lead us throughout our lives gradually, step by step, up that final mountain, where the multitudes of the angels have gathered for the feast.

Celebrating the Christian Mystery

Monsignor Bruce Harbert - Thoughts on today's Mass

For Jesus' closest friends, the sight of him transformed on the holy mountain was like seeing the light at the end of the tunnel. He had told them that he must die, and now he gave them a glimpse of his destiny after death, when he would rise in glory. We too see the light at the end of the tunnel as that gospel story reminds us today that Lent is about Easter. Moses and Elijah, who appear with Jesus, both shared something of his desert experience, Moses by enduring 40 years in the desert before his people entered the promised land, and Elijah by suffering hunger for 40 days before he was received in splendour into heaven. In Lent we make their experience our own for, as the Preface reminds us, Jesus has taught us that 'the path of suffering leads to the glory of the Resurrection'.
