



GOSPEL REFLECTION



What comforting words Our Lord is giving his disciples! Comforting for us too. There are, he says, "many rooms" ("mansions!) in his Father's kingdom: rooms for all. Nor is the Kingdom somewhere strange to us. We have 'seen' with the eyes of Faith and know Jesus and in him we already know the Father. "The Father and I are one," Jesus says elsewhere. lesus promises to be there to welcome us and it is in the power of the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, that we come to the Kingdom. "The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God." Certain parts of Scripture give a more terrifying impression of arrival in the Kingdom, but Our Lord reassures us: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust.." You are coming

home, he is saying; this "place" I am going ahead to prepare is a family home, the home of God's children. St Therese of the Child Jesus. through all the intense suffering of her illness, went to Heaven rejoicing: rejoicing to meet the Father, rejoicing that as Our Lord promises, in Heaven she would perform great works' and throw down roses from Heaven!

Celebrating the Christian Mystery A new series drawing on themes from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (ccc).

Christ's call to conversion continues to resound in the lives of Christians. This second conversion is an uninterrupted task for the whole Church who, "clasping sinners to her bosom, (is) at once holy and always in need of purification, (and) follows constantly the path of penance and renewal." This endeavour of conversion is not just a human work. It is the movement of a "contrite heart," drawn and moved by grace to respond to the merciful love of God who loved us first.

Monsignor Bruce Harbert - Thoughts on today's Mass

The prayer in today's Collect that the newly baptized may 'bear much fruit' comes from Our Lord's words at the Last Supper, as recorded in the Gospel of John, Chapter 15. (In fact, those words form the Gospel at the Mass of the Fifth Sunday of Easter in Year B of the Lectionary). When the Liturgy echoes the Scripture, it is always to good to turn to the Scripture to find the place from which the liturgical text is taken, since the Scripture often sheds light on the Liturgy. In John 15, Jesus speaks of himself as the vine from which we grow, his 'branches'. He tells us that if we remain in him we shall bear much fruit. So today's Collect implies, though it does not say, that in order to bear much fruit we must remain united to Christ like branches on a vine.
