GOSPEL REFLECTION



The Love of God has been poured out into our hearts, which is the Holy Spirit dwelling within us.

Today the Church is born! The Holy Spirit comes down upon the Apostles to confirm them in their ministry of teaching all nations and of baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Church is now flooded with the pervasive presence of the Holy One, who reconciles the world to Himself, and unites all peoples in one bond of charity.

In the Holy Spirit we are given the means to be able to grow in knowledge of the Father, who has

been revealed to us in His Son Jesus Christ. We proclaim the name of Jesus in faith, the name by which all are saved, the name of Him who died for our sins and rose again to draw us into Himself and to reconcile us with His Father. We belong to the Body of Christ. In that Body we are one with our Head because of the one Spirit who gives life to the entire spiritual organism.

Celebrating the Christian Mystery

Interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart, an end of sin, a turning away from evil, with repugnance toward the evil actions we have committed. At the same time it entails the desire and resolution to change one's life, with hope in God's mercy and trust in the help of his grace. This conversion of heart is accompanied by a salutary pain and sadness which the Fathers called animi cruciatus (affliction of spirit) and compunctio cordis (repentance of heart). CCC 1431

Monsignor Bruce Harbert - Thoughts on today's Mass

In today's Collect we recall 'the divine grace that was at work when the Gospel was first proclaimed', praying that it will fill the hearts of believers again in our own time. That grace drove Jesus' disciples out to preach, and everybody understood them. They showed both enthusiasm and intelligence. How much we need those gifts again today, faced as we are by so many different cultures and by so much indifference and hostility, as we remember Our Lord's parting command to 'teach all nations'. We echo these thoughts after Communion when we pray that the gift of the Holy Spirit may 'retain all its force'. When these prayers were first composed, some 1300 years ago and more, thousands of people in Europe had not heard of Jesus Christ. Christians who used these prayers at Pentecost went out and took the Gospel to them. Now it is for us to do the same.
