



OPENING OF CHURCHES FOR MASS: St Luke's Church has now been open for the last two weeks for private prayer on Sundays and Wednesdays, and it is hoped that we will shortly be able to re-start the public celebration of Mass. When we do open this will not be a return to "Normal" as I'm sure you all understand. REFLECTION SHEET: This week there are two Reflection Sheets provided by the Diocese for use during private prayer. Alongside the [Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time](#) reflection sheet is a [Prayer Resource for July](#): Month of the Precious Blood of Jesus. Again some copies will be provided in the Church but you may wish to print off your own copy beforehand to bring with you. These sheets are provided on the website and can be accessed here. Please remember if you do pick up a copy or bring your own, all single-use materials should be taken away with you when you leave. Thank you.

ORDINATIONS TO THE DIACONATE AND PRIESTHOOD: We can look forward to the ordination at the Cathedral of four men to the transitional Diaconate and one man to the Priesthood on 25th July and 4th August respectively. Sadly, public health restrictions will require these celebrations to be small-scale gatherings, though the cathedral livestream will allow many more to participate remotely.

CRUSADER MAGAZINE: We have also received the July issue of *The Crusader* magazine, the free magazine of the Crusade of Mary Immaculate. These will be available with the Reflection Sheets when you first enter church for private prayer. It includes a reflection on Psalm 139 which you might find helpful during your visit or when you pray at home. Please take a copy with you.

MEASURES IN PLACE DURING PRIVATE PRAYER: St Luke's is now open for private prayer for about an hour on Wednesday and Sunday mornings, from 10:00am. Please note that the following measures are in place for your safety:

- There will be a restricted number of **10 people** in the church at any one time.
- Should the number of visitors to the church exceed that number you will be asked to wait by a steward. Private prayer will then have to be restricted to a maximum of **15 minutes**.
- Please maintain social distancing at all times. To ensure that this can be maintained, you may be asked to wait by a steward, particularly at any "bottlenecks" within the building.
- Hand sanitisers will be provided at the entrance and within the porch and should be used by all visitors.
- Doors and windows will be open as much as possible to allow for the flow of fresh air.
- The church toilets will be closed to the public.
- There is a one-way system in place for visitors. For those visitors who would prefer to use the ramp, please let a steward know and they will be happy to accommodate your needs.
- Votive candles will be placed in the holders in advance to avoid cross-contamination, and an initial candle lit which may be used to light other candles.
- Visitors are asked **not** to touch statues during their visit.
- No food or drink will be allowed on site (should you require water please ensure your bottle is of the sports-cap type, not a twist cap bottle).
- Please take with you any single-use materials which you use for private prayer.
- Children are **very welcome** to attend, but parents or guardians must manage them appropriately, particularly ensuring that they touch as few surfaces as possible.
