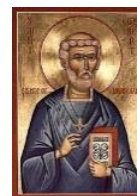

**HOLY WEEK SERVICES:** Following all guidance provided by the Diocese, the Celebrations for Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum will be in the presence of Christ's faithful. The service times for our joint parish are as follows (unless otherwise stated the services will be held at St Luke's):

- † **Holy Thursday** - Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, 1<sup>st</sup> April - 7:00pm (at St Cuthbert's)
- † **Good Friday** - Stations of the Cross - 10:30am (at St Cuthbert's)  
- The Celebration of the Lord's Passion, 2<sup>nd</sup> April - 3:00pm
- † **Holy Saturday** - Easter Vigil, 3<sup>rd</sup> April - 8:00pm
- † **Easter Sunday** - 4<sup>th</sup> April: 9:00am (at St Cuthbert's); 11:00am



Please be aware that restrictions on numbers at each service will still be in place. As this is the most important week in the Church's calendar, we expect that **ALL** these services will be fully booked in advance - please contact Victoria (07913 073575) for spaces at any of the services at St Luke's and Chris (07970 811043) for all those to be held at St Cuthbert's.

**ATTENDING ONLINE:** The Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments suggests that there should be a focus on the liturgies presided over by the Diocesan Bishop so that those who are "unable to attend their own church should follow the diocesan celebrations as a sign of unity". The times and necessary links to join the services from Shrewsbury Cathedral will be provided in next week's newsletter.

**THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD:** The feast of the Annunciation of the Lord celebrates the Angel Gabriel's appearance to the Virgin Mary and his announcement that she had been chosen to be the mother of the saviour of the world. The Annunciation, which means "the announcement", is celebrated on 25<sup>th</sup> March, nine months before Christmas.



**DAY OF PRAYER FOR SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL ABUSE:** The worldwide Catholic Church joins together on the Friday of the fifth week of Lent in this special day of prayer. Together we pray:

*Heavenly Father, who loves and cares for all of your children, especially the smallest and most vulnerable, we entrust to you the lives of the many children and vulnerable adults, who have been sexually abused, and whose trust and innocence have been destroyed. Help us to hear their cries of pain and to take responsibility for so many broken lives. We pray that within their communities and families they may find understanding and support so that with the help of your grace their wounds may be healed, and they may again know peace. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son. Amen.*

To mark this as a parish, there will be Stations of the Cross at St Luke's at 6:15pm on Tuesday evening.
