

26th; and **Parishioners' Intentions**, Sunday 28th.



WEEK XII: This Monday is the Feast of **Ss John Fisher & Thomas More**. After a distinguished academic career at Cambridge, John Fisher was appointed Chancellor and Bishop of Rochester in the same year. Thomas More was an Oxford scholar, a noted humanist and apologist, and an incorruptible judge and parliamentarian. Both were drawn into conflict with King Henry VIII over his divorce of Catherine of Aragon and papal supremacy. They were imprisoned and beheaded for treason in 1535.



The Nativity of St John the Baptist is celebrated on Wednesday, 24th June. The life of John the Baptist is interpreted as a preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ, and the circumstances of his birth, as recorded in the Gospel of Luke, are miraculous. This is one of the oldest Feasts of the Christian church, dating back to 506, when it was celebrated, like Christmas, with 3 Masses: a vigil, at dawn and at midday. Let us follow St John's lead and "leap for joy" over the good news that Jesus is with us always.

OPENING OF ST LUKE'S FOR PRIVATE PRAYER: It is with great joy that we are able to open St Luke's Church from this Sunday, 21st June, for private prayer. A professional, Covid-19 secure clean has been carried out in the building. While this was quite expensive it was thought this would provide the best option for the health and safety of our parishioners. Volunteer stewards will be in place to ensure all visitors follow the relevant social distancing and other guidelines from the Diocese, which are based on current governmental guidance. While guidance is likely to change over the coming weeks, stewards will be following the guidelines that are currently in place and your patience and understanding while we all learn how this "new normal" will work is very much appreciated. Details of the measures that are in place are provided below and will be updated as the guidelines change.



Father James was advised by the Vicar General on behalf of the Diocese that he should aim to open only one of our churches for the time being. It is hoped that St Cuthbert's will also be able to open for private prayer at some point in the future, but in the meantime all St Cuthbert's parishioners can be assured of a very warm welcome to private prayer at St Luke's.

ORDINATIONS: The Diocese is happily due to see five ordinations this summer, four to the transitional Diaconate and one to the Priesthood. Please remember those going forward for Ordination in your prayers, hoping that the advice and guidance, which is on-going with the Governmental Task Force, will allow provisions to be in place for these ordinations to be celebrated before the autumn.

MEASURES IN PLACE DURING PRIVATE PRAYER: St Luke's will be open for private prayer for about an hour on Wednesday and Sunday mornings, from 10:00am, from **Sunday, 21st June**. Please note that the following measures will be in place:

- There will be a restricted number of **10 people** in the church at any one time.
- Should the number of visitors to the church exceed that number you will be asked to wait by a steward. Private prayer will then have to be restricted to a maximum of **15 minutes**.
- Please maintain social distancing at all times. To ensure that this can be maintained, you may be asked to wait by a steward, particularly at any "bottlenecks" within the building.
- Hand sanitisers will be provided at the entrance and within the porch and should be used by all visitors.
- Doors and windows will be open as much as possible to allow for the flow of fresh air.
- The church toilets will be closed to the public.
- Votive candles will be placed in the holders in advance to avoid cross-contamination, and an initial candle lit which may be used to light other candles.
- Visitors are asked **not** to touch statues during their visit.
- No food or drink will be allowed on site (should you require water please ensure your bottle is of the sports-cap type, not a twist cap bottle).
- Please take with you any single-use materials which you use for private prayer.
- Children are **very welcome** to attend, but parents or guardians must manage them appropriately, particularly ensuring that they touch as few surfaces as possible.
